

What Do I Do With.....?

A guide to bulky waste recycling and disposal in Tulane's uptown and downtown laboratories



Old Lab Equipment

Submit an equipment transfer Certification form to OEHS. Request for verification of decontamination from Office of Biosafety for equipment with potential biohazards. Submit IT to Facilities Services for pick up.



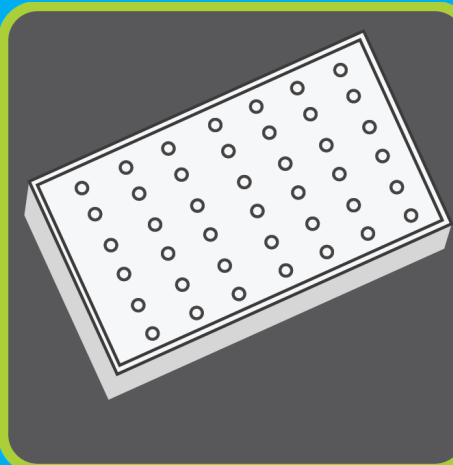
Broken Glass

Line cardboard box with clear, heavy liner. Fill no more than 50% full, seal liner, close and tape box. Submit a Service Wave and record ticket number. Label box with PI/ group name, building, and phone number, "Broken Glass Waste," and ticket number. Place in hallway for pickup.



Computers & Electronics

Place a Service Wave request for "recycle electronics". (Computers used in labs should first follow above procedure for verification of decontamination for old lab equipment.)



Tip Boxes & Styrofoam Coolers

Purchase products from companies with mail-back reuse programs for packing of products such as tip boxes and Styrofoam coolers. VWR has a tip box recycling program and Sigma Aldrich and New England Biolabs provide styrofoam cooler mail-back.



Sharps & Red Bag Waste

Ask your Departmental Safety Representative, Office of Biosafety, or OEHS for procedures. NEVER place in regular trash areas.



Paper, Cardboard, Bottles, & Cans

Use designated bins provided at facility and set cardboard next to waste bins for pickup. See recycle.tulane.edu for more detail.
